Polar candlesticks . . . for endless night! (10-12 years old)



Did you know?

In winter, the sun does not rise in polar countries...

You need:


- glass jars (yogurt, jam, ...)
- paper napkins in different colors (with several layers)
- tealights
- wallpaper paste
- recycled cardboard
- 1 sheet of white paper to print the pattern
- paint brush, glue, pencil, scissors and ruler

To print the pattern, see on the previous page

!!! So you get a template to trace around many times!!!



Prepare a little wallpaper paste, mixing powder with water following the directions on the box.



Select animals whose size most closely match the size of your glass jar.



Cut them out,



glue them on the cardboard, then cut the cardboard.





Measure the height of your glass jar.



Cut out of the napkin a long strip of the same height.



Wrap it around the jar and cut off the excess.



Split the napkin into 2 or 3 layers. Then use one "ply" or thickness of the napkin.



Using a paint brush, put glue on the whole jar.



Carefully, roll the thin strip of napkin around the jar. Don't worry if there are a few wrinkles.




Once the strip is wrapped, put another layer of glue on the jar.



Make several jars by playing with colors.







Trace around the templates on colored napkins and cut the animals out . . . !!! Do not separate the layers of the napkins!!!







Put glue on the jar where you will place the animal.

Gently, place the cut animal, then brush the glue on it.

Glue several animals all around the jar.



Play with the colors . . . then let the jars dry overnight.

Put a tealight inside each jar and light

... and appreciate the atmosphere!
