

Polar wheel . . . who lives where ? (8 - 10 years old)






Discover polar animals with the wheel . . . from the North and

in blue: the Antarctic cover






Cut the 2 wheels and glue them back to back.

!!! Pay attention!!!

Check by holding up to the light that the 2 centers holes match . . . After gluing, trim them if necessary!!!





Cut the 2 covers!

Don't forget the cut outs!

One cover has to be

longer than the other!!!

using a sharp pencil make
a hole in the center of the

covers and wheel.





Put the wheel between the covers and slip a brad through the holes already drilled.

!!! PAY ATTENTION!!! The wheel must be in the right direction!!!

The bear must be absolutely be seen from the North Pole cover . . .

while the penguin appears on the side of the South Pole cover.







Turn the edge of the larger cover and glue it to the other cover as shown on the picture. Glue also the 2 upper corners of the cover.

Then turn the wheel and discover "who lives where?" ...

Did you know?

- Belgica Fly has no wings. It has adapted because winds are too strong in Antarctica.
